Medical Services

The Interfaith Community Clinic provides basic medical care and preventative health care services to those in need. Individuals helped by the clinic do not have any form of medical insurance including Medicaid, Medicare, Hospital District Coverage, Veterans benefits or Workers Compensation.

A few common medical services provided include but are not limited to:

- Freatment for common, non-emergent medical problems such as respiratory infections, allergies, urinary tract infections, muscle and joint pain, and minor injuries.
- Management of chronic health problems such as diabetes, hypertension, asthma and COPD.
- Preventative health exams such as pap tests, mammograms, cholesterol screening and periodic childhood immunizations clinics.

Dental Services

Basic dental care services are provided by the Interfaith Community Clinic to qualified patients who are without dental insurance.



The services provided include:

- Bi-Annual Dental Cleanings
- Simple X-rays to Diagnose Problem Areas
- Fillings and Extractions

The following procedures are not offered by the clinic at this time: partial plates, dentures, crowns, root canals, braces or implants.

RESTRICTIONS: We do not provide services for:

- Individuals who have any type of medical or dental insurance including Medicare, Medicaid, Hospital District Coverage, Veterans benefits or those who are covered by Workers Compensation.
- Women who are pregnant or individuals seeking treatment for infertility.
- Surgical or hospital based care. ICC may assist patients who require more complex care by referral to other resources.
- Individuals with serious mental health or substance abuse disorders requiring psychiatric care or treatment.

Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteerism is a vital component of the Interfaith Community Clinic.
Approximately 90% of all services are performed by licensed professionals volunteering their time to help our patients. The clinic's volunteers are truly the key to our success. Below are a



few of the many volunteer opportunities:

Medical and Dental Volunteers

Professional volunteers of licensed physicians, nurses, medical providers, dentists, dental assistants, and den hygienists work together to provide patient care.

Social Service Volunteers

Individuals assist with obtaining basic demographic information about the patients and explain the clini policies and procedures. They assist the patient in obtaining other health care or social service resource that may be available for them or their family.

Administrative Volunteers

- Office Assistants: Volunteers assist with greeting patients, answering and directing phon calls, scheduling appointments, filling out paperwork and answering general questions.
- Translators: Individuals translate during the interview with Social Services and during the medical or dental exam.
